- Alert relevant authorities to problems that arise or work that needs to be undertaken
- Help the other tiers of local government keep in touch with their local communities

Parish councils have a wide range of powers regarding local matters and have the power to raise money through taxation, the precept, which is the parish council's share of the council tax.
